(1)Community engagement:

a. Rural Patrols

Bassano Detachment continues to take Rural property crime as its top Priority. Therefore, we have made serious efforts in increasing the amount of patrols in rural farm properties, and the Downtown area located in Hussar and Wheatland county.

We have also made an effort to increase police presence during our night shift in your downtown area location to help prevent opportunity thefts.

We also know that in order to help stop/prevent rural property crime we need the help of our community and would like to educate members of our public to stay vigilant and inform Bassano RCMP with any suspicious vehicles or occurrence's. We also recommend that property owners lock any unsecured property on their land, and install trail cameras when possible.

Bassano RCMP have started a new program with major oil field companies in your area to better share information on how to help prevent copper theft during summer months. This program will be up and running in March.

*A patrol consists of a minimum of 45 minutes in the said area.

b. Community relations

Officers of the Bassano Detachment encourage members of the community to attend Bassano Detachment to have coffee and discuss any issues they may be having, or to simply talk. Being aware of the distance for community members from Bassano we have made it a priority for us to be in your area more frequently to answer any questions or concerns as much as operationally possible. We have also assigned a specific member to your area named Cpl. Sebastian ANDREWS

(2)Traffic:

Members of Bassano Detachment take the safety of your roads very seriously and have been making more attempts to help keep them safe with numerous vehicle stop's in town and on the highway with sobriety being the number one concern. There has recently been new legislation in effect that requires all drivers to submit to mandatory Alcohol screening when requested by Police.
