# WINTER SNOW REMOVAL AND GARBAGE COLLECTION

Public Works is going to be working hard again this winter to keep our streets clear of snow and ice. Please help us by removing all motor homes, trailers and other vehicles (if possible) from the streets. If you need help clearing your sidewalk this winter please contact the Village Office. (This service is only offered to those residents who are physically unable to clear the snow). You are responsible to clear your own sidewalk

Garbage will not be picked up in alleys unless they have been cleared of snow and the truck and trailer are safely able to pass through. If your alley is not clear on pickup day (Wednesday), please put your bags in the front of your property.

## 521-18 Unsightly Premises Bylaw - SNOW REMOVAL:

21. The Owner or Occupant of a Property of land adjacent to a Sidewalk or pathway shall remove ice and snow from that portion of the Sidewalk or pathway adjacent to the Property so that the Sidewalk is cleared within 48 hours after the snow or ice has been deposit to ensure that the Sidewalk does not remain in an Unsafe Condition.

22. A Person may, in such a way as to not injure or unduly interfere with any other Person lawfully using the Sidewalk, use a power driven device that is sufficiently light and of such construction that it will not injure the surface of the Sidewalk to remove snow or ice from any portion of a Sidewalk.

23. Where a person uses an ATV or other vehicle to remove snow from a Sidewalk, as provided for above, approval for such use will be required from the Village. In order to obtain this permission the Village may require the following:

- a. The operator of the ATV must be at least 16 years of age;
  - b. The operator must provide proof of insurance and registration for the ATV;
  - c. The operator must provide a map of the area to be cleared by the ATV; and
- the operator may be held liable for any damages to private Property or Village Property, including, but not limited to, Sidewalks and Roadways.

24. A Person who removed snow or ice from public or private Sidewalks or Property shall not deposit said snow or ice upon any Sidewalk, Roadway, or public or private Property without permission from the Owner of such Property and, shall not impede storm sewer runoff, including runoff caused by melting snow or ice, or block access to any fire hydrant, driveway, or wheelchair ramp.

## Frequently asked questions:

### Q. Are the grass clippings and tree pile behind the gun range open?

A. No, all piles behind the gun range are now closed. The grass clippings pile has been relocated to the last overflow campground site. The Chip Pit accepts clean bare lumber, trees cut to 10 ft lengths, brush, pallets, and branches. There is also a bin for pressure treated wood.

### Q. Do I need a development permit?

Thinking of putting up a fence, garden shed, garage, deck or doing some work on your house this year?

A. Development permits are issued by the Village Office and are generally required for decks, accessory buildings, new builds and additions. Any construction that does not require an approved permit (for example a fence), still must comply with the Land Use Bylaw or you can apply for a variance

### Q. Do I need an animal license?

A. Yes, ALL dogs and cats within the Village must be licensed annually. Spayed/neutered Cats & Dogs are \$10, all others are \$20 (third pet is \$50 and requires an application to be filled out and approved by Council as per the Animal Control Bylaw). This includes all indoor and outdoor cats and dogs.

### Q. Can I set off fireworks in the Village?

A. Fireworks are not allowed unless you receive permission from Council and the fire department.

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## COVID-19 Provincial Restrictions

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Expanded health measures will be in effect province-wide. All Albertans, businesses, organizations and service providers must follow all new health measures.

New expanded mandatory measures come into effect Dec. 8 for social gatherings and mandatory masking. All others come into effect 12:01 a.m., Dec.13.

### **SOCIAL GATHERINGS - Effective Immediately**

- All indoor and outdoor social gatherings – public and private – are prohibited. This does not apply to service visits from caregivers, health or child care providers and co-parenting arrangements.
- Close contacts are limited to household members only. Individuals who live alone may have the same two non-household close contacts for the duration of this restriction.

### **MANDATORY MASKING – Effective Immediately**

- The mandatory indoor public masking requirement will be extended province-wide.
- Applies to all indoor workplaces and facilities outside the home. Applies to employees, visitors and the general public. Farm operations are excluded.

### **PLACES OF WORSHIP – Effective Dec. 13**

- All places of worship will be limited to 15% of fire code occupancy for in-person attendance, with physical distancing and masking.
- Virtual or online services are strongly encouraged
- Drive-in services where individuals do not leave their vehicles and adhere to guidance will be permissible and are not subject to capacity restrictions.

### **RETAIL SERVICES – Effective Dec. 13**

- Retail services must reduce customer capacity to 15% of fire code occupancy, with a minimum of 5 customers.
- Curbside pick up, delivery and online services are encouraged.
- Shopping malls will be limited to 15% of fire code occupancy.

### **CLOSURES – Effective Dec. 13**

- Restaurants, pubs, bars, lounges and cafes will be closed to in-person service. Only take out, curbside pickup and delivery services are permitted.
- Casinos, bingo halls, gaming entertainment centres, racing entertainment centres, horse tracks, raceways, bowling alleys, pool halls, legions, and private clubs will be closed.
- Recreational facilities – fitness centres, recreation centres, pools, spas, gyms, studios, day and overnight camps, indoor rinks and arenas – will be closed.
- Entertainments businesses and entities – libraries, science centres, interpretive centres, museums, galleries, amusement parks and water parks – will be closed.
- Hotels may remain open but must follow restrictions – no spas, pools or in-person dining. Room services only.
- Personal and wellness services, including hair salons, nail salons, massage, tattoos, and piercing, will be closed.
- Health services, including physiotherapy or acupuncture, social or protective services, shelters for vulnerable persons, emergency services, childcare, and not-for-profit community kitchens, or charitable kitchens will remain open for in-person attendance.

### **WORK FROM HOME – Effective Dec. 13**

- Mandatory work from home measures will be implemented unless the employer determines that work requires a physical presence for operational effectiveness.

**These restrictions will be in place for a minimum of four weeks.**
